### Clunes OSHC

Clunes Outside School Hours Care (formally COOSH) reopened on the 30th September with Northern Rivers Children's Services (NRCS) as the new providers, in charge of the operation and administration of the service from their Lismore office. During the recent school holidays children from Clunes and Rosebank enjoyed a variety of fun packed theme days, with the most popular being Lego Masters where they used their imagination and creativity to take part in challenging Lego games and construction. I Scream for Ice Cream party involved experimenting to make ice cream in a bag and edible playdough ice cream flavours; Viva La France taught children how to draw the Eiffel Tower in oil pastels and speak French; for Perfect Pandas children learned 'Kung Foo Panda' moves and crafted a bamboo wind chime. Children also built cardboard cubbies, decorated a rainbow serpent, played emoji twister and designed shark chatterboxes, as well as enjoying plenty of recreational time to socialise and make friends while riding bikes, climbing on the fixed equipment and playing hide and seek. At Clunes OSHC, the qualified educators enable children to organise active games and learn how to play together without using 'screens' to occupy them. So, if you are concerned about the amount of time your children spend passively engaged online, or you need child-free time to study, work or 'chillax', Clunes OSHC is open to all 5-12 year old school children for vacation and after school care. It is held in the hall at Clunes primary school, Walker Street, commencing after school care on October 14 and vacation care on December 23rd.
